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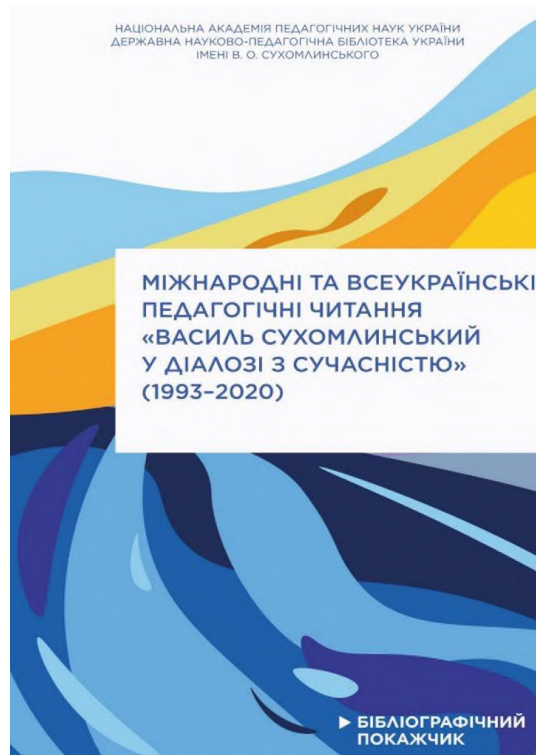
## REVIEW OF VASYL SUKHOMLYNSKYI IN DIALOGUE WITH MODERNITY

The National Academy of Educational Sciences of Ukraine, together with the V. Sukhomlynskyi State Scientific and Pedagogical Library of Ukraine, has produced a new bibliography of research into the legacy of Vasyl Sukhomlynskyi. The bibliography records papers produced for presentation at annual conferences held over the 27 year period from 1993 to 2020. This publication will be welcomed by Sukhomlynskyi scholars around the world and is a testimony to the continuing relevance of Sukhomlynskyi's work in the 21 century.

This very substantial bibliography is 457 pages in length and contains 3 130 bibliographic entries, as well as alphabetical indexes b-v author and title. It is a record of research conducted for 27 national conferences. 10 of which were also international conferences involving the participation of scholars from countries outside Ukraine.

The vast majority of the papers listed in the bibliography, were presented by educators from within Ukraine, many of them practising teachers. This demonstrates that educators in Ukraine continue to draw inspiration and guidance from Sukhomlynskyi's very extensive legacy. The topics under discussion at the annual conferences are wide-ranging and include the development of positive relationships between teachers and students. guidance for families. health education. individual and collective responsibilities. values education, early childhood education, philosophy for children" the development of creativity, inclusive education, the New Ukrainian School reforms, and the education of patriotic citizens. Sukhomlynskyi's legacy seems to provide an inexhaustible source of inspiration and guidance that becomes more relevant with each passing year. The widespread adoption of many of his ideas. and continuing popularity his literary works for children, has no doubt contributed to the strong character of so many Ukrainians that is demonstrated in the current crisis.



Also of interest are the contributions of international scholars that are recorded in this bibliography and associated with the 10 international conferences. Professor Lovat from Australia, for example, writes of the inspiration and guidance that Sukhomlynskyi provided for the Australian Values Education Program. The involvement of international scholars helps to strengthen ties between Ukraine and the international community" as well as expanding the influence of Sukhomlynskyi's ideas. The bibliography is an electronic resource that is freely accessible over the internet. Many of the most significant works listed in the bibliography may also be freely accessed over the internet through the links provided, and this is one of the most valuable features of the work. The scholars who created this bibliography are to be commended for producing such a valuable reference tool.
